TAHS prepares and empowers English language learners to build a better life and inspires them to become global-minded leaders in their communities.





Foundational English

Level 1:

Students build their vocabulary and grammar to feel comfortable in everyday situations. During the second part of Level 1, students begin to explore more advanced vocabulary, and concepts such as essay structures.

Level 2:

Students will find themselves challenged by more advanced grammar and further broaden their vocabulary, preparing themselves for the Academic English needed to succeed at Level 3 and 4.



Academic English

Level 3:

The first of the two advanced levels, Level 3 helps students learn English through academic materials (lectures, scientific passages, campus based themes) in all four skill areas (reading, writing, listening, speaking). As a result, students learn concepts and vocabulary necessary to comprehend a wider range of topics from different disciplines, including earth science, social sciences, and business.

Level 4:

Level 4 further improves students' academic competence by exposing them to increasingly challenging materials from university lectures and increasingly challenging texts taken from a wide variety of academic journals, magazines, and other publications.

Level 5:

Students can only enroll level 5 upon completion of level 4.

In level 5, students will apply their academic English skills to three challenging TOEFL content areas. Students will hone their TOEFL test prep skills and deepen their academic knowledge in (1) humanities (2) physical sciences and (3) life sciences. The curriculum, materials, class size, and schedule are all designed to help you achieve a higher score.

1:1 Courses

IELTS

Learn from materials created by IELTS examiners how to respond to Speaking and Writing prompts to maximize your score. Identify tricks used on reading and listening part of the IELTS exam. Learn strategies for how to improve accuracy and reading less at the same time.

GRE

Students will work with their instructor to improve English reading, writing, and mathematics skills. In addition, they will develop critical thinking skills and communicative competence. Students can also learn useful test-taking strategies to fully prepare for the exam.

College Application Assistance

College Application course teaches students to select universities, pass college interviews, and write Personal Statements.

Business English

Students will gain more understanding about the American business culture and develop professional language useful for the business world. They will practice specific skills including writing emails and oral negotiation.

Focus on Reading

Students whose reading scores in core courses need improvement must take Focus on Reading course to ensure their future progress in the school and further academic success. Students read challenging texts of different types and develop their comprehension and critical thinking skills.

Focus on Speaking

Students who have strong accents that impede communication must take this course to progress through the levels. Students who want to improve their speaking, can choose to take Focus on Speaking where they will practice speaking on a wide range of topics and in varied situations such as debate, pair discussions, presentations. In addition to accent reduction, students will learn collocations that will make them sound more natural in everyday situations.

Focus on Writing

Students whose spelling and/or grammar need major improvement must take Focus on Writing to ensure further progress. Others can choose to take this course to advance their writing skills. Students will learn to write cover letters for employers and universities; they will practice writing essays and creative writing.



2. How long does it take to improve my English skills?

Everyone is very different in terms of their level of English. Some students have strong reading and listening skills while other students are better at speaking and writing. That's why we offer a FREE Diagnostic Test before we start a class. After the Diagnostic Test, our academic directors will create a personalized study plan with you.

3. I need to study for the TOEFL. Can I take the TOEFL class at TAHS?

We are specialized in TOEFL preparation, and as an ETS-Authorized TOEFL Testing Center, our students can take a practice test on the exact computers used for the actual TOEFL Test. As a result, our students feel more comfortable when they take the exam at our center. Additionally, our teachers have the highest level of experience with teaching TOEFL. We will make sure you receive your target score.

4. I want to join the Harvard Extension Program. Do I need to take TOEFL?

The Harvard Extension Program recently changed the English proficiency test requirement. If your native language is not English, the program requires you to provide designated proof of English proficiency to be enrolled in any Extension School course. The required score for TOEFL is 100. For more information, please visit their official website.

5. When can I start the course?

Our program is designed to be a six-week course. However, if you want to join the program right away, please give us a call (617-492-2722) or send us an email at admin@theacademy.ac.

6. What is the registration process?

We usually start with a placement test, and after the placement test, we will help a student with registration. For TOEFL classes, we can accept a recent TOEFL test score, but for a more accurate consultation, we may still ask a student to take the placement test. Our placement test is free and takes about 2 hours to finish.

7. Do you offer SAT, GRE or GMAT courses? What about college application essays?

Many international students come to the United States to pursue higher education. On top of our TOEFL program, TAHS offers other test preparatory courses, such as SAT, GRE, and GMAT. We also support our students through essay writing assistance, transfer process, and university selection guidance. When you join TAHS, our academic advisors will help you construct your future plans through specific academic goals.

8. Do you offer I-20's?

Yes, we offer I-20s to full-time international students who enroll for at least 18 hours/week. To maintain your status as an F-1 student in the United States, you must enroll in a full-time course.


